A EAST-WEST CONNECTOR TRAIL

Sharp Park, 1401 Elmwood Drive, Lansing
2.5-mile trail located in Delta Township offers connectivity to beautiful parks, library, Lansing Mall and other attractions.

B FRED MEIJER CLINTON-IONIA-SHIAWASSEE TRAIL

107 E. Railroad Street, St. Johns

42-mile trail originates at the western edge of Owosso, travels through St. Johns, and concludes at the eastern boundary of Ionia.

C HAYHOE RIVERWALK

213 S. Jefferson, Mason

2.5-mile trail through Mason, largely along Sycamore Creek. Recreation walking for exercise or bird watching.

D LANSING RIVER TRAIL

Maguire Park, Jolly Road & Aurelius Road, Lansing 10.2-mile trail connects scenic overlooks, historic landmarks, parks and cultural centers. Multiple access/endpoints.

MERIDIAN INTERURBAN PATHWAY

Shopping Center at Marsh Road and Haslett Road 1655 Haslett Road, **Haslett**

1.95-mile interurban trail along Consumers Energy utility corridor. Trail connects to two residential areas and Old Raby Road trail.

F NORTHERN TIER TRAIL

Across the street from Family Aquatics Center, 6400 Abbot Road, **East Lansing**

4.5-mile trail connects nine East Lansing park sites through wooded lots and assorted wetland, prairie and open spaces. Natural wildlife habitat.

G SOUTH LANSING PATHWAY

Benjamin Davis Park (east lot)

5500 Pleasant Grove Road, Lansing

5.5-mile trail runs along the Consumers Energy utility corridor through four parks, along wetland areas, and connects neighborhoods, commercial areas, Lansing River Trail and Sycamore Creek Trail.

H SYCAMORE CREEK TRAIL

Trailhead Park, 4111 Holt Road, Holt

3.24-mile wooded trail connects to Lansing River Trail, under I-96 to Willoughby Road, and connects to Valhalla Trail with elevated structure across Sycamore Creek.



1 BENNETT PARK

1225 S. Cochran Avenue, Charlotte

117 acres of natural scenery, paved and gravel trails, Veterans Memorial Park, and a historic courthouse site along the Battle Creek River.



2 BURCHFIELD PARK

881 Grovenburg Road, **Holt**Over 540 acres along the Grand River. Swim area, picnicking, canoe livery, recreational sports, 16 miles of trails for hiking, mountain biking, moonlight and cross country skiing. Entry \$3-5.



3 CREGO PARK

1600 Fidelity Road, Lansing

In south Lansing, this 200-acre park offers quiet water sports like fishing, canoeing and boating (non-motorized). Connecting to the Lansing River Trail.



4 DELTA MILLS PARK

7001 Old River Trail, **Delta Township**Covering 32 acres, this beautiful park offers many amenities and access to the Grand River.

5 FENNER NATURE CENTER

2020 E. Mt. Hope Avenue, Lansing

Interactive learning center ideal for families. 4.5 miles of trails. Visitor center with reptiles, bird viewing and nature history library.

6 FITZGERALD PARK

133 Fitzgerald Park Drive, Grand Ledge

Home of "The Ledges," a 300-million-year-old 60-foot sedimentary rock outcropping on the Grand River, this 76-acre park includes 3 miles of trails. Entry \$3-5.



7 FOX MEMORIAL PARK

3981 E. Gresham Highway, Potterville
This 100-acre park (50+ acres currently developed)
contains a picturesque lake. Entry \$3-5.



8 FRANCES PARK

2701 Moores River Drive, Lansing
Stroll through the rose garden, a loop trail or view the
Grand River.



GRAND WOODS PARK

4500 W. Willow Highway, **Delta Township** This 128-acre park has 3+ miles of trails, a radiocontrolled racecar track and a disc golf course.



10 GRANGER MEADOWS PARK/VALLEY FARMS PARK

1275 Granger Meadows Lane, Lansing
This 76-acre year-round park includes in-line skating,
3/4-mile of mulched trails, 1.75 miles of paved trails,
and 70-foot high sledding hill.



111 HARRIS NATURE CENTER

3998 Van Atta Road, Okemos

Forests, meadows, 6 miles of nature trails and a 3/4-mile paved trail along the Red Cedar River. Family programs year-round.



12 HAWK ISLAND PARK

1601 E. Cavanaugh Road, Lansing
One of the region's largest and most diverse parks, it features a beach, splash park, boat rental, beach

house/snack bar, boardwalks, horseshoe pits and a winter sports hill. Over 1.5 miles of paved trails that connect with Scott Woods Park and with the Lansing River Trail. Entry \$3-5.



13 HAWK MEADOW PARK

6160 Delta River Drive, Delta Township This 148-acre park includes 4.5 miles of trails.



14 HUNTER PARK

1400 E. Kalamazoo Street, Lansing %-mile paved trail plus pool and splash park.



15 HUNTER'S ORCHARD PARK

7242 Old River Trail, **Delta Township**This park includes 1.3 miles of river trails, wheelchair accessible for 2/3-mile of the trail.



16 INGHAM CONSERVATION DISTRICT

1031 W. Dexter Trail, **Mason** 200 acres of green space includes a 5K trail. Seasonal hunting available.



17 LAKE LANSING PARK NORTH

6260 E. Lake Drive, Haslett

Over 530 acres of natural recreation area and woods. 5 miles of hiking trails convert to ski trails. Equipment rental. Entry \$3-5.



18 LAKE LANSING PARK SOUTH


1621 Pike Street, Haslett

30-acre site, located on a 410-acre lake. Beautiful sandy beach, boat rental, horseshoe pits. Entry \$3-5.



19 LINCOLN BRICK PARK

13991 Tallman Road, **Grand Ledge**This 90-acre park's environment varies from woodlands and meadows to scenic river frontage.



20 NANCY L. MOORE PARK

2100 Gaylord C. Smith Court, **Haslett**This 108-acre park offers team sports and basketball

court plus 2 miles of creek-side nature trails and a 1/2-mile paved trail.



FRANCIS MOTZ & CLINTON LAKES COUNTY PARKS

Fully accessible 315-acre recreational area with 3 lakes and carry-in boat launches, 3 miles of pathways with wildlife and scenic views.



22 PATRIARCHE PARK

960 Alton Street, East Lansing
New 1.2-acre playground with modern design.



23 POTTER PARK & ZOO

1301 S. Pennsylvania Avenue, Lansing Over 450 animals, adjacent to the Red Cedar River, live pony and camel rides and playgrounds. Entry \$2-10.



24) SHARP PARK

1401 Elmwood Drive, Delta Township
On 58 acres, Sharp Park features a fishing pond and access to the East-West Connector.



25 SLEEPY HOLLOW STATE PARK

7835 E. Price Road, Laingsburg

This park covers over 2,600 acres, including a river and 410-acre lake; rental cabins available. Entry \$11.



26 TOLLGATE WETLANDS

1101 N. Fairview Avenue, Lansing 11 acres of wetlands, limestone cascades, ponds, interpretive signs and a 1/2-mile walking path.



27 VALHALLA PARK

Pine Tree Road & Keller Road, Holt 45-acre site features a wooded area, open fields, lake, swimming beach, changing rooms and concessions.




